FROM A PASTOR'S DESK:

What is it that you find consuming your life? For some of us it might be relationships. That can mean living life to please others, or desiring the attention of someone, or believing that without certain people being part of our lives life would stink. Some of us are consumed by reaching our goals. That can be financially or whatever we perceive the “good life” to be. For some of us life is simply about survival, keeping up with the responsibilities that seem beyond our capacity, or just getting through another day.

Regularly we need to refocus and that is where God's Word is needed. One of those refocusing verses for me is found in 1 Peter 3:18 where it states:

“Christ suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God.”

The gospel is the enjoyment of fellowship with God himself. This is clear in the simple phrase “that he might bring us to God.” All the other gifts of the gospel exist to make this one possible.

- We are forgiven so that our guilt does not keep us away from God.
- We are justified so that our condemnation does not keep us from God.
- We are given eternal life now, with new bodies in the resurrection, so that we have the capacities for enjoying God to the fullest.

We need to ask ourselves, “Why do I want to be forgiven?” and “Why do I want to be justified?” and “Why do I want eternal life?” Is it simply to escape the wrath of God or is it because I genuinely want a relationship with Him and want to enjoy Him?

The gospel-love God gives is ultimately the gift of himself. This is what we were made for. This is what we

lost in our sin. This is what Christ came to restore. As the Psalmist wrote in Ps. 16:11:

“In your presence, there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore.”

I can't speak for you, but I know that I need to regularly be reminded that my joy is found in my relationship with my creator. He created us for that purpose and when we look to anything else to fulfill that purpose we will walk away empty and disappointed.

It's hard to describe the feelings that are flowing right now. It won't be the same without Lew in the front row giving himself completely in worship and taking notes about everything that is taught on. We are going to miss him!
